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EDITORIAL

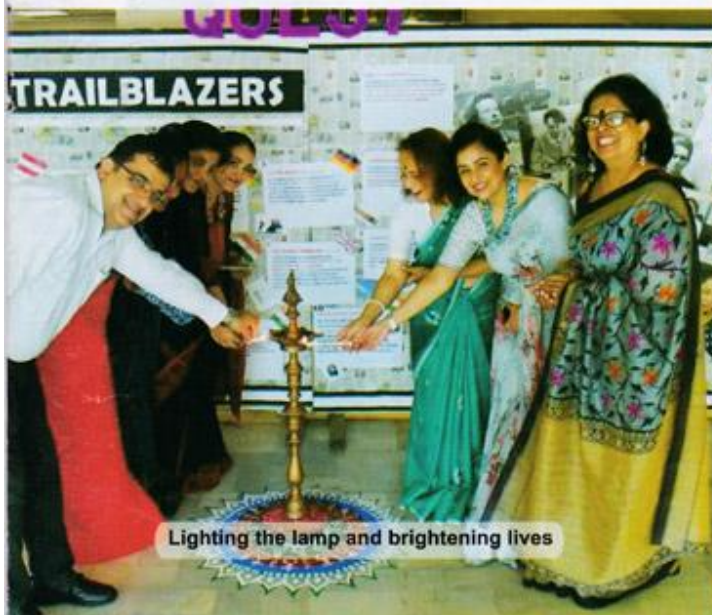
The Youth of a Nation are the trustees of posterity.

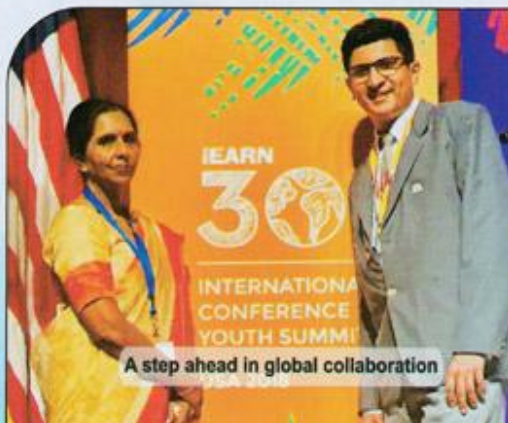

FOUNDATION DAY

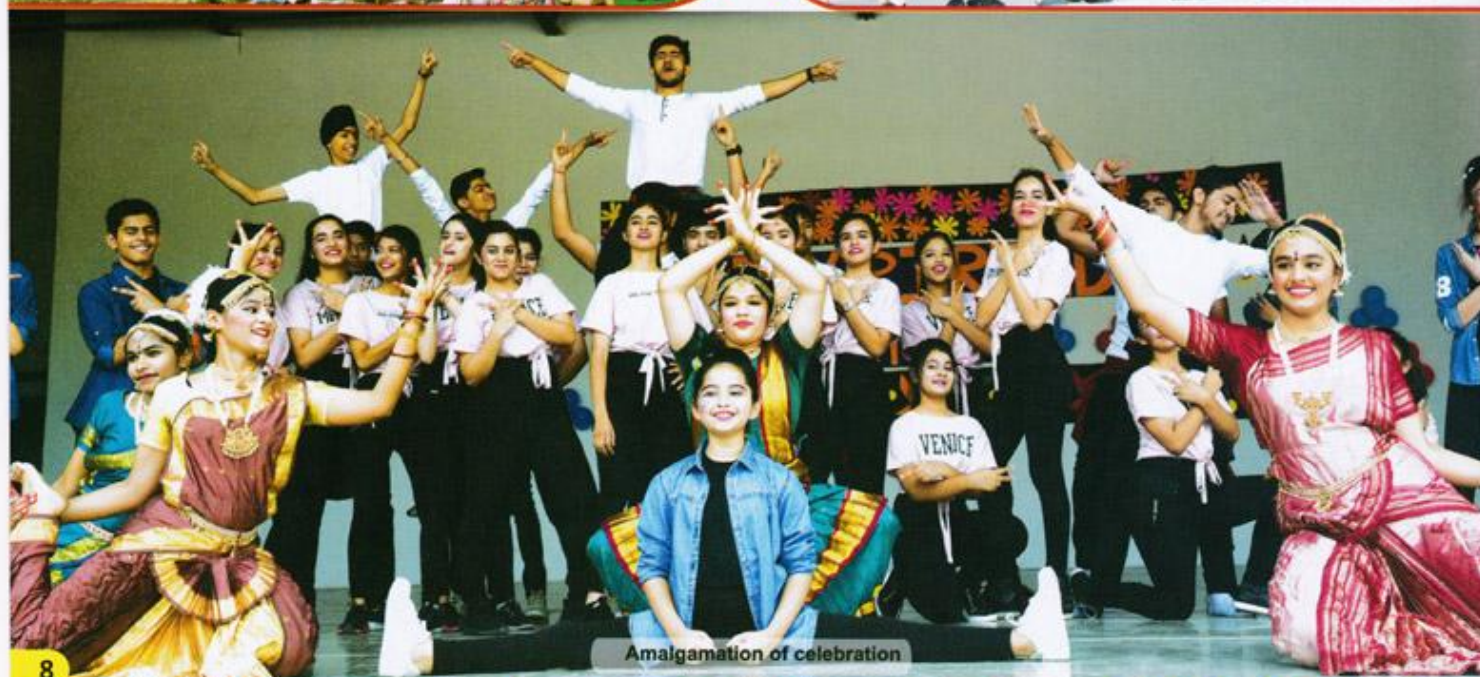

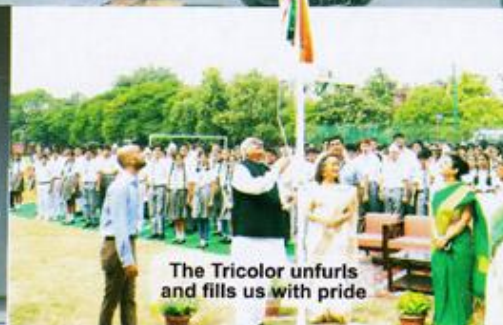

INTER CLASS HINDI PLAY COMPETITION (VII & IX)

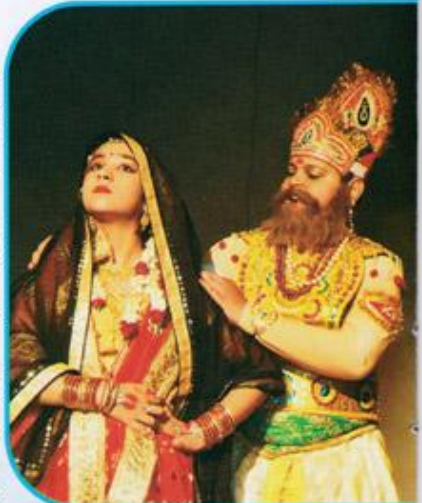

'Curiosity is the wick in the candle of learning'.

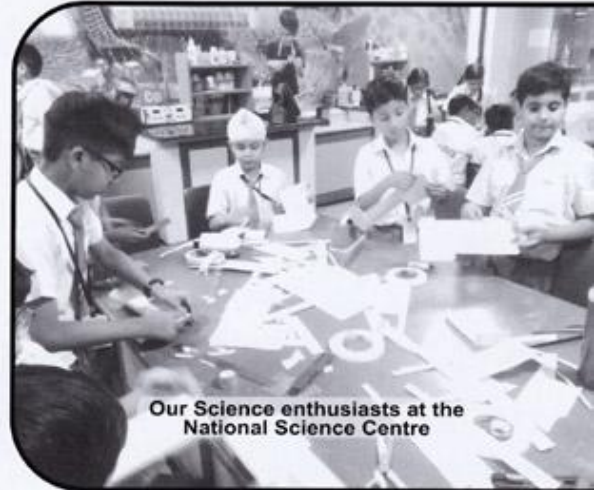

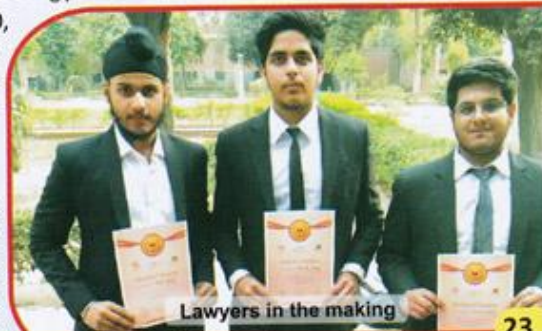

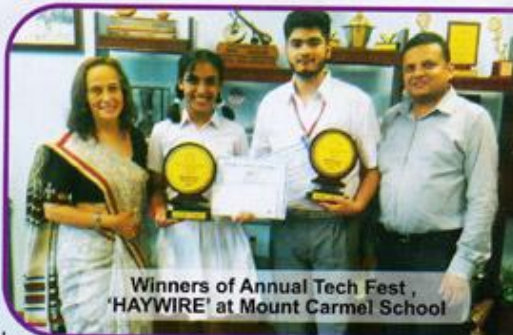

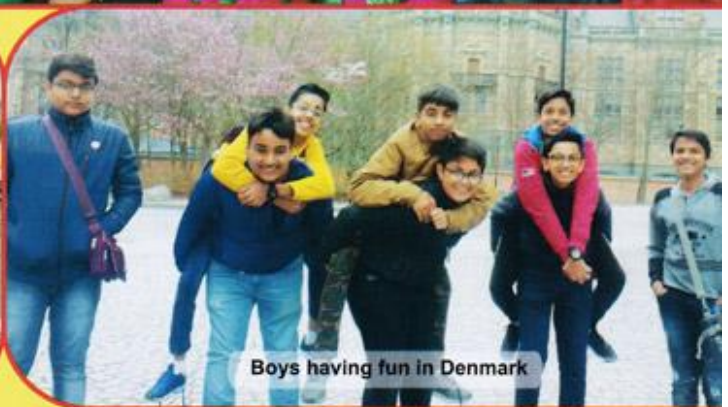
