Independence Day

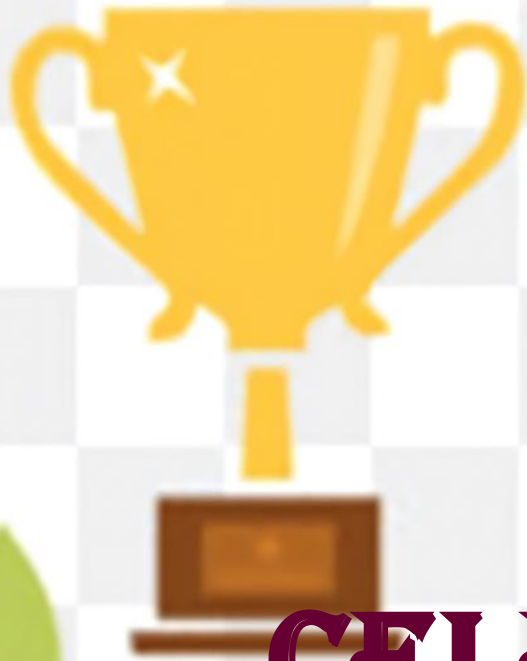

'Remembering Shakespeare'- International Virtual Quiz:

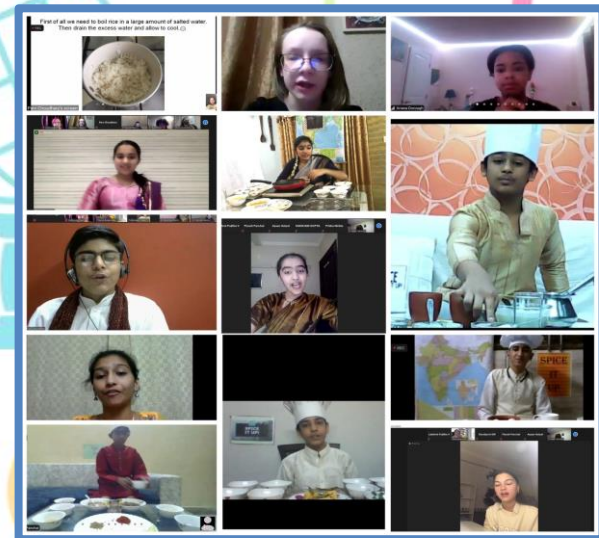




Change makers Conclave

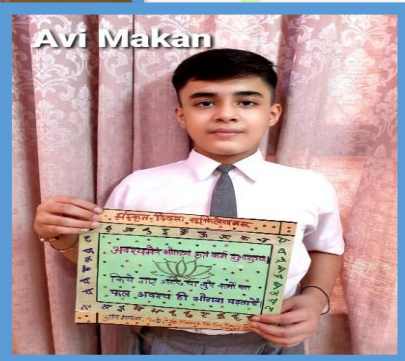

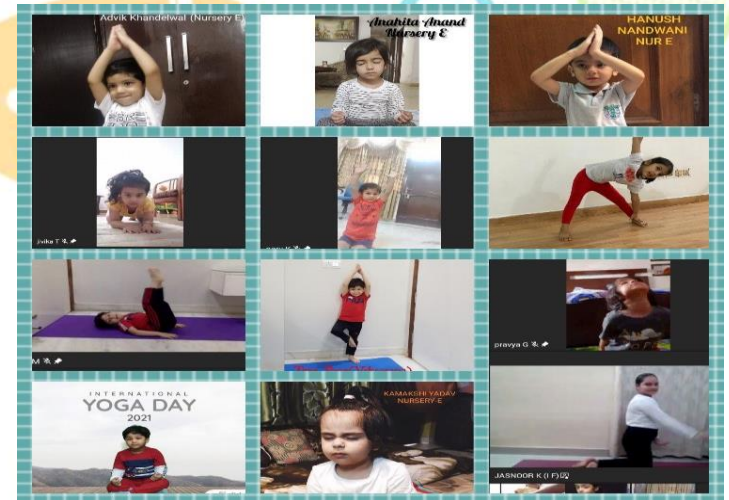
