






PATHSHALA NUKKAD KI

Students of class 11 attended the inaugural ceremony of 'Injecting vaccine-A New hope, at the National Science Centre on 15 November 2022. It was an interesting experience that offered knowledge about different kinds of viruses, their structure, life cycle, and also how vaccines can help us protect against the diseases they can cause. Observing the exhibition allowed a deeper understanding of various concepts required for developing a vaccine.

TOY BASED PEDAGOGY SESSION

Our Vice Principal Mrs. R. Anand was invited to facilitate a one-day session on conceptual understanding of Toy Based pedagogy organized on 3rd October by DIET Rajinder Nagar. Toy-based pedagogy, a teaching-learning approach that is based on learning 'through toys and games, is in alignment with the NEP 2020. This helps in simplifying and clarifying new concepts and bridges the content of different subjects seamlessly in a logical and learner-centric manner.

MANDALA COLOURING COMPETITION

Under the project Happiness, ORION Choco-Pie organized a Mandala colouring competition for the students of Class 5 on 11 October 2022. The students participated and coloured the given pictures of Mandala Art with their creativity. This fun-filled activity witnessed enthusiastic participation by all the students. WORKSHOP -'THE HISTORY OF PERFUMES'

Ten students from Nirmaan enterprises participated in a perfumery workshop on 14 November 2022. The workshop was conducted by Mr. Kristian Nasteski from Croatia. It was a very informative, interactive, and entertaining workshop. The children were taught about 'The History Of Perfumes', and great emphasis was put upon' The game of Attention'. During the session children gained knowledge about different types of scents, some very common like rose and mogra and others not so popular like mint and oud. Overall, the session was worth it as the children learned how to make perfumes using certain oils.

WORKSHOP -EFFECTIVE TEACHING OF ENGLISH

Ms. R. Sahni and Ms. B. Mittal attended a workshop on Effective Teaching of English conducted by the renowned speaker, Mr. Barry O' Brian at Sumermal Jain Public School, Janakpuri. Mr. Brian talked about how teachers can use theatre to make the teaching-learning experience more effective and fruitful. The teachers learned how they can use facial expressions, voice modulation, and gestures to engage the students in a way that they never forget what was taught in the class and become naturally enthusiastic about learning further. He also gave examples of how music and reading aloud can become the primary tools to enhance the language-learning process.

PREVENTION AND MANAGEMENT OF SUBSTANCE ABUSE SESSION

The sessions and activities for Prevention and Management of Substance abuse were conducted by our Senior Wing Counselor, Ms. M Kapoor in all sections from classes 9-12. Students were given information on various substances and how addiction starts with just experimentation. Students gave perceived advantages and disadvantages of various substances by holding a debate. They were asked to narrow down the psychological, physical, societal, and economic causes of addiction. Then the concept of a "safety net" to identify trusted adults/ confidents whom they can approach in case they get stuck in a situation or want to seek help from others, was discussed.

CBSE HEALTH AND WELL BEING PROGRAMME

Schools are the key forums for acquisition of health-related knowledge. They are envisaged as nodal centres for skills-based health promotion programmes. The CBSE Programme for Health and Well-being of school going children, aims at being an initiative that builds on the experiences of children to enhance their health and support their holistic development.

Our school also organised a variety of activities. A healthy snacking activity-'Healthify Me' was organized for the Home Science students of Class XI. The students prepared healthy dishes like carrot fritters, nacho chaat, mini uttapam and chutneys, sandwiches, sweet lime juice with fruit salad, chia pudding, and made everyone aware of the nutritious value of the delicacies prepared for them.

They also conducted interactive sessions on **Adolescence-Growing up Healthy** with the Class VI students to spread awareness on menstruation, physical – cognitive and emotional changes during puberty, and social taboos associated with these changes. The students of grade 6 were asked to submit their queries in an anonymous format through a question box and the queries were addressed by grade 11 students.

An **activity on Anaemia** was also organised for them. The students were asked to bring vegetables rich in iron as their lunch on certain days to reinforce the importance of the same. The student volunteers chosen from class 8 visited each section of class 6 as Members of Iron Brigade during the lunch break to make sure that the children participated wholeheartedly in the activity.

An **Oral Hygiene Interactive** Session was conducted for the students of **Class VII** by Dr. Deepika Verma (Certified in Dental Aesthetics and Dental Cosmetology) Dr. Verma stressed that everyone especially young children should brush twice a day to remove bacteria and plaque. The key takeaway from the Session was that - Dental health and Physical health are inextricably linked so taking care of our oral health is part of taking care of our overall health.

The students of grade 7 had a **yoga session**. Warm-up exercises were done and all the students then performed sitting and standing asanas. The benefits of the postures were also told side by side as children performed with the instructions. In addition to that, the senior students helped the students of class 7 in making their **weekly diet plans** for their physical fitness. The students were given information about how they can plan their diet including all the vital nutrients required in a day and were also made aware of its benefits in their life. A PowerPoint presentation was shown in all sections of **Classes 8 and 9** based on **different types of violence** with special focus on domestic violence. Healthy group discussions were held. Students discussed problems sharing how different forms of violence affect mental health which also affects learning ability.

Under the theme 'Values and responsible citizenship' two skits were enacted by the students to spread awareness about the importance of Helpline Numbers and to teach them about FUNDAMENTAL RIGHTS. The children were also taught to respect each other's religion.

A video raising **awareness against HIV-AIDS** was shown in classes 9 to 12.
