








DAY 2 31 MARCH 2014

on the collaborative projects via padlet & feedback forms.


As it was our last day, the school organized a Farewell Dinner for all of us. We all got ready in our

towards our home with our host buddies.





This year, I hosted an Indian guest. The guest told me that she had really a memorable and enjoyable trip to Singapore and that her first time


to Singapore was a good one. She said that Singapore's rules/laws are too strict.
