PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

“Physical development is the growth and development of both the brain and body in early childhood.”

YOGA DAY

Help your child to perform asanas like Vajrasana, Anuloma Pranayama, Bhujangasana, Vrikshasana etc. Prepare a video and sent it to your class teacher by 17th June, 2024.

LEARNING OUTCOME: This activity will help students in developing physical strength, flexibility and balance.



COLOUR HOP

Create various coloured circles on the floor, then call out a colour and instruct your child to hop onto the same-coloured circle. Prepare a video and send it to your class teacher latest by 30th May, 2024.

LEARNING OUTCOME: This activity will help students in exploring various colours and building their physical strength.



SENSORY PLAY

Encourage your child to engage in sensory play with items like play dough or sand.

LEARNING OUTCOME: Students will develop their fine motor skills, creativity and cognitive abilities.

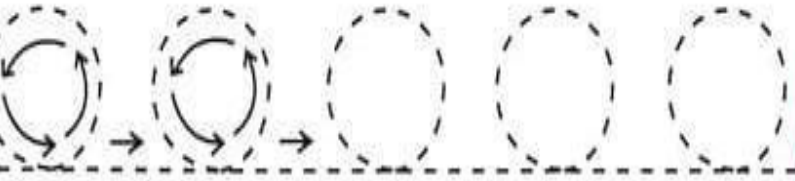
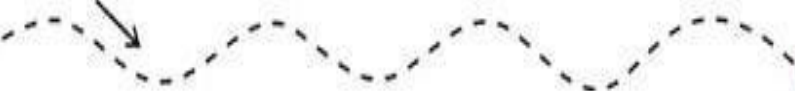




GET GOING

LANGUAGE DEVELOPMENT

LET’S CONVERSE IN ENGLISH

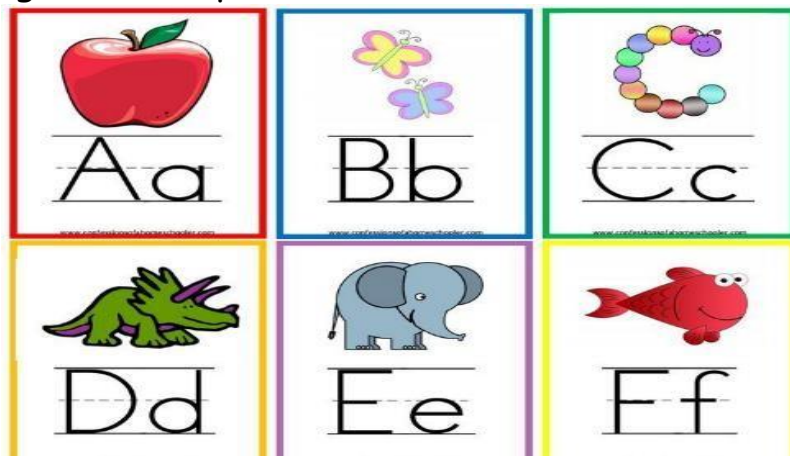
- How are you?

“In the garden of life, social and personal development are the seeds of compassion and the blossoms of understanding.”

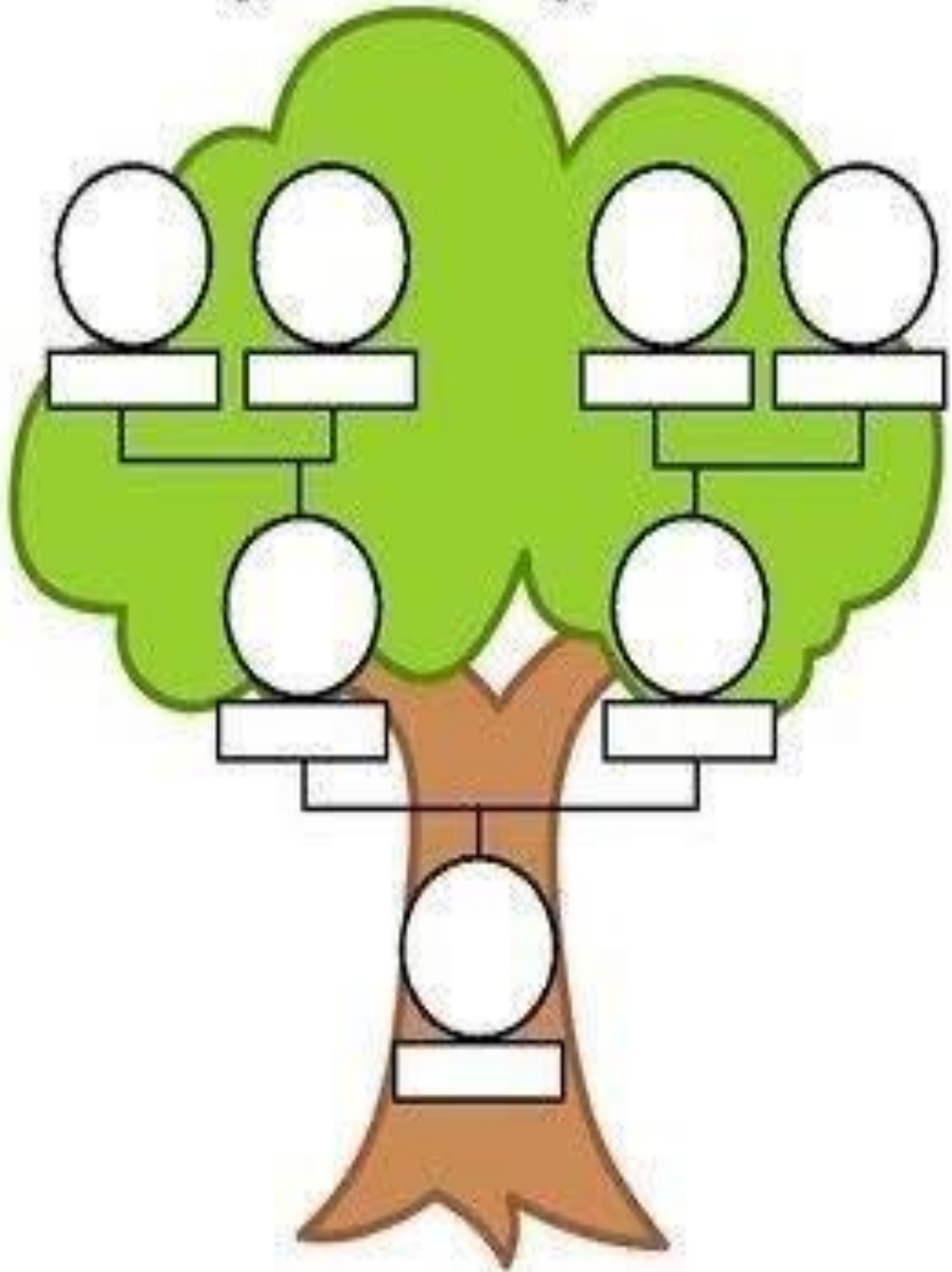
LEND A HELPING HAND

My Family Tree



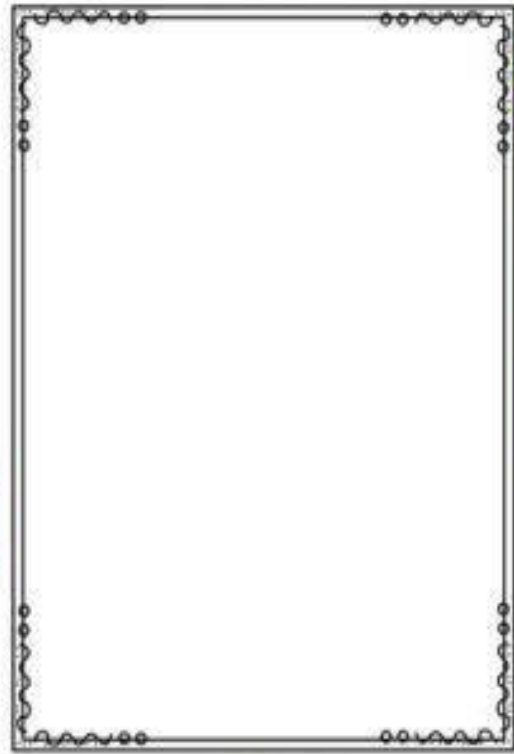

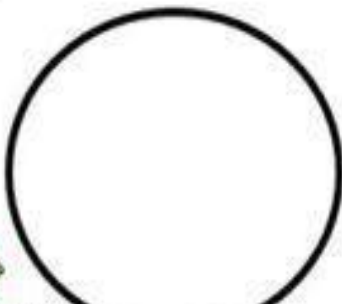

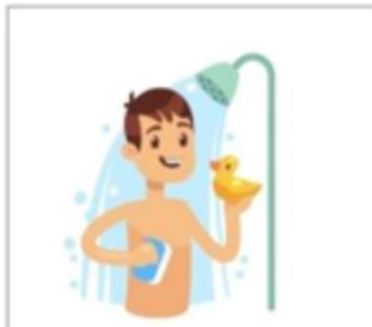

EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT

LEARNING OUTCOME: This activity aims at promoting emotional bond between the father and the child as it fosters the sense of security, love and trust.



STORY WITH GRANDPARENTS

Encourage your child to spend time with their grandparents and learn some moral values from them.

LEARNING OUTCOME: This activity helps the grandparents in enriching their grandchildren's lives by providing them guidance, develop empathy, understanding and emotional resilience.



INQUISITIVE DEVELOPMENT

BEST OUT OF WASTE
